

SEAMLESSLY CONNECTED: A SINGLE-FAMILY HOUSE IN SALZBURG

Modern living in the countryside: a single-family house has been built in Salzburg, Austria, in which the boundaries between inside and outside are elegantly blurred and all living areas are seamlessly connected. The TEAM 7 store in Linz is responsible for the detailed design. The manufacturer from Ried is also responsible for numerous pieces of furniture and customised products.



Holistic living concept

With its large windows, the new building opens up an extensive view of the surrounding meadows and fields. Large, metal-framed sliding and swinging glass doors also create openness and space inside. They cleverly provide an unobstructed view that extends from the front door out into the garden. All three floors of the house are stylishly harmonised by a holistic living concept: It combines warm natural materials such as oak wood, fabric and leather with cooler elements made of metal, ceramic or glass. Soft beige and grey tones meet deliberate black contrasts, which lends dynamism to the ambience and makes it both inviting and cosy.

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Harmonious transitions

The centrepiece of the house is the kitchen, which forms an open-plan structure together with the dining room. The special feature: the centre cupboards are integrated directly into the window front, creating a direct connection to the outdoors. This practically brings the garden inside and emphasises the architecture's closeness to nature in an unusual way. The cooking island with sink not only provides ample opportunity for extensive communal cooking, it also brings together the key design features of the interior once again in miniature: Oak fronts and grey ceramic surfaces, plus several details in black such as the handles, wine cabinet and tap. The dining area in the immediate vicinity is again characterised by a long echt.zeit dining table that can seat numerous guests. Its tabletop made of natural wooden planks, combined with comfortable grand lui chairs and elegant display cabinets, creates an expressive ensemble that skilfully picks up on the rest of the room's aesthetics.

Tailor-made special designs

The transitions to the living room and home office are similarly harmonious, where the generous use of natural wood creates a cosy, warm atmosphere. In addition to the furniture, this is also ensured by the specially developed wall panelling with oak rods - a design element that can be found in the living room and hallway. This is not the only special design that TEAM 7 has created for the new building. To provide the large living room window with an oak frame, for example, the construction had to be specially fitted into the sloping window reveal. In the dressing room next to the bedroom, a dressing table is part of the high wall unit, as is a laundry chute that leads directly into the cellar. There are also numerous other practical solutions - for example, the heating distributor has been elegantly concealed by a sideboard and the fully illuminated mirror cabinet in the bathroom has been inserted directly into the brickwork. Examples such as these emphasise the individual character of the house - and illustrate how TEAM 7 makes personal design wishes a reality.
